C K SMOUHA AND SUZANNA HUBBARD



The Problem With Pierre plays with the format of the book, splitting each spread down the middle – the page on the left is Bertam's neat-as-a-pin living room, and the right hand page is Alan's homely chaos. A twist at the end brings together form and content in a way that is sure to delight readers young and old.



This timely book conveys a serious message with a refreshing lightness of tone in both text and illustration.



The New Baby is an adorable activity paperback created to help children make sense of what it means to become a sibling.






This is a madcap tale of tolerance and acceptance that is brought to life in wild '80s comic-style illustrations, complemented by neon printing and luxurious packaging.



With a witty twist at the end, this is a funny, thoughtful book about staying true to yourself in the face of people who insist they know better.


